

## **All IN for Democracy 2021 Action Plan**

Participate in Fair Maps Day, April 30, on Twitter or Facebook by posting a short video explaining why redistricting is important to you. Use the hashtag #OurFairMaps, tag your state rep and state senator individually, #INLegis collectively. Also tag the coalition @AllINForDemocracy.

Contact your state representative and state senator: Tell them you participated in the ICRC public hearing process and that the Indiana General Assembly should follow our recommendations on redistricting. Find your legislators at [iga.in.gov](http://iga.in.gov).

Contact legislative leadership (Huston, Bray, Wesco, Jon Ford). Redistricting must be open and transparent. Give us a real chance to participate. Hold virtual and in-person public hearings around the state. Use the time the census delays give to engage Hoosiers in a conversation about new districts.

Write a letter to the editor, call in to radio shows, suggest local public affairs television shows focus on redistricting and the ICRC, suggest podcasts on the issue.

Follow All IN for Democracy, Common Cause IN, LWVIN, ACLU IN, W4C, CAC and others on social media, share information on your pages.

With ICRC members and others from your community, meet with your local legislators – educate them about redistricting and ask for their support. Email [jvaughn@commoncause.org](mailto:jvaughn@commoncause.org) if you are interested in joining the lobbying team in your community.

Get your faith group, neighborhood group, service organization involved – have a speaker on redistricting.

Are you a business owner? Member of the Chamber of Commerce? Get them involved.

Plan an event in your community – virtual or in person later this summer. July 17 Elbridge Gerry Birthday events: Gerrymander Meanders, Pub Crawls, info at county fairs, farmer's markets

Organize a community mapping workshop to help identify communities of interest in your city.

Attend a DistrictR training workshop to learn how to map your community and draw new districts. First opportunity is April 29<sup>th</sup> at 7 p.m. Register at <https://bit.ly/3er8XP2>

Are you a teacher? Get your students involved in the mapping competition.

Work with your city council or county commission to pass an ordinance creating a citizens redistricting commission for local redistricting.

Work with your city council or county commission to pass a resolution calling on the IGA to follow the ICRC's recommendations.
